MUSIC IS BACK - FINGERS CROSSED!

COVID-permitting, the library's much-loved music program will resume in August with two offerings – one classical and one contemporary.

The Affinity Quartet, which was scheduled to perform at the library last year, will now perform on Friday 20th August from 6pm. Nicholas Waters (violin), Jenny Khafagi (violin), William Clark (viola) and Mee Na Lojewski (cello) have established themselves as one of the country's leading string quartets, with a host of critically-acclaimed performances in Australia, Europe and the UK. The members hold principal and contract roles with orchestras including the Melbourne Symphony, Sydney Chamber, Sydney Symphony and Australian Chamber.

The following Friday (27th August) it will be a contemporary music evening with Rebecca Barnard and Monique Brumby.

Rebecca, who has previously performed at the library, grew up listening to Billie Holiday and Louis Armstrong, and started singing with her father's band when she was just 13. At the age of 14 she heard Joni Mitchell and Bob Dylan and was hooked. Rebecca founded the band Rebecca's Empire, and has sung with artists including Stephen Cummings, Paul Kelly, Tim Rogers, Renee Geyer, Deborah Conway and You Am I.

Rebecca will be joined by first-time-library performer Monique Brumby, an Indie pop/rock singer-songwriter, guitarist and producer. Monique has had top 40 hits in Australia and collaborated and co-written songs with many artists, including Paul Kelly. She is committed to social justice and community engagement, singing in prisons and participating in music mentoring workshops.
