MUSIC: STEVE LUCAS AND JEROME SMITH FRIDAY 1 APRIL AT 6PM

It's been four years since Steve Lucas and Jerome Smith performed together at the library – but they'll be back on Friday 1st April from 6pm.

Prior to their previous Ath performance, Steve wrote: "I'll be sharing the podium with Jerome Smith. One hour that will literally fly by. I love when he talks about San Francisco in the early 70s, playing and hanging out Jefferson Airplane and some of the biggest names around."

Jerome has toured and recorded with artists including Mick Jagger, the Divinyls, Billy Thorpe and Jimmy Barnes. He grew up in Harlem and was raised on country and western, and soul music by his father and gospel music by his mother. From the age of seven Jerome knew he was destined to play bass.

Steve, a singer/songwriter and producer, is the last surviving founding member of infamous Aussie punk band X, and *Rolling Stone* magazine dubbed him a living legend as part of his 40th anniversary of playing professionally as a musician.
