REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

MELBOURNE  
MECHANICS' INTITUTION AND SCHOOL OF ARTS,

FOR THE YEAR 1866.

1. The Committee of Management, in presenting the Annual Report for 1866, and inviting attention to the financial statement appended, have the satisfaction of being able to point out that they have been enabled to work the Institution efficiently, and at the same time to reduce the liabilities as compared with the preceding year (reckoning net income only of each year) by the large amount of £177 9s. 1d., leaving a balance of only £60 against the Institution, which sum is due to members on account of Library Deposits for the safe return of books.

2. The Committee, therefore, having full confidence in the prospects of the Institution recommend that certain indispensable repairs be proceeded with at once. A thorough repair of the roof of the building is imperatively required. To paint, paper, and repair the hall, the staircases, lobby, reading room, and library, is equally necessary. It is estimated that these works will cost altogether about £150; and the Committee are of opinion that this sum may safely be appropriated out of the revenue of the ensuing year, so as to avoid the necessity of borrowing. It is with regret your Committee have to announce the death of Mr. Dinwoodie, by which the Institution has lost a very useful and estimable member of Committee.

3. During the year the Rules have been revised and printed for the use of members.

4. By the Abstract of the Treasurer's Account Current for 1866, and the Statement of the Liabilities and Assets annexed, it will be perceived that there has been an improvement in the net receipts for 1866 over those of 1865 amounting to £47 0s. 2d., and the Committee are of opinion that the income for 1867 may be fairly estimated at £1000.

5. The Committee have endeavoured as far as possible to render available and augment the utility of the Library and Reading Room; many important new books and periodicals have been added, and where necessary duplicate copies have been procured. A complete list of new books and periodicals added during the year can be seen in the Library.

6. The number of new books added to the Library during the past year was 148 volumes. There have been also added 122 volumes of periodicals, making a total of 270 volumes for the year.

7. The number of members on the roll for the year 1866 is 450. The number of new members who joined the Institution in 1866 was 123. The number of Life Members is at present 124, and of Honorary Members, 18.

8. The number of members borrowing books from the Library during the past year was 402. The number of volumes in circulation was 13,102; and the number of magazines in circulation during the same period, was 9,100.

In conclusion, the Committee have the satisfaction of pointing out that notwithstanding a small decrease in the number of members, the income has exceeded that of the previous year, especially in the items of rents and subscriptions. It is also important as indicating the increased utility of the Institution, that there has been a considerable increase in the study of the more important works of literature and science, and a corresponding decrease in the perusal of the lighter class of publications.

No Entrance Fee is charged. New Members can join at any period of the year.  
Any Member borrowing Books from the Library may be required to leave with the Secretary a deposit of £1, for the safe return of the property.

The sons and apprentices of Members, under eighteen years of age, may be admitted as Junior Members upon payment of 10s. annual subscription.

Members have the privilege of gaining for any friend who shall live beyond the precincts of Melbourne, or who shall be a naval or military officer, or the captain of a vessel trading to this port, free admission to the Reading Room for a period of one month in any year, by entering the name and address in the Introduction Book.

The Reading Room is open daily from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., Sundays excepted.

The Library is open from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.; 4 to 6 p.m.; and 7 to 9 p.m.

On Saturdays the Library is closed from 2 p.m. to 7 p.m.
