REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

MELBOURNE ATHENÆUM

FOR THE YEAR 1873.

1. THE Committee have much pleasure in presenting the members of the Institution with a report of the transactions of the past year.

2. The progress made by the Institution has proved of an eminently satisfactory nature. The general revenue rose from £1022 1s. 4d. for 1872 to £2015 11s. 6d. for 1873, while the number of subscribers increased from 640 to 1139.

3. At a special meeting held on February 10th, 1873, the subscription to the Ladies' Reading Room was fixed at ten shillings per annum.

4. The additions to the Library during 1873 amount to 705 volumes. The number would have been considerably greater were it not for the fact that, comparatively speaking, very few publications of sterling merit have been issued from the English press during the latter months of the year. The work of re-organising the Library is now in progress. A large quantity of surplus and mutilated books have been withdrawn from the shelves they uselessly encumbered; these have been sold at fair prices, and the space they occupied is available for fresh additions. A uniform and more handsome style of binding than that formerly in vogue has been adopted, the result being an improvement in durability as well as appearance. The Committee,

fully alive to the chief element of success in all libraries of a circulating nature, have given orders to largely supplement the existing stock of books by completing the sets of well-known authors' works, and securing a supply of the latest publications per mail steamer.

5. In the Reading Rooms the number of papers has been largely augmented, and still further additions will be made to meet increasing requirements. It is estimated that the number of visits made to the principal Reading Room during the year was upwards of 100,000. A saving of nearly twenty-five per cent. has been recently effected in the cost of the English periodicals furnished to the Institution, and an increased supply will shortly be on the tables.

6. The following classes have been inaugurated, and are well attended, viz., French, German, Elocution, Singing and Dancing. Offers have been received from experienced teachers for the formation of other classes for instruction in Latin, Spanish, Italian, English Literature, Free-hand and Mechanical Drawing and Oil Painting. A preparatory class for Civil Service Examination candidates is also on the list. On the receipt of sufficient names for any one of these, steps will be at once taken to commence the class.

7. The new Hall, which only required to be known to become popular, has been in good demand, and has given general satisfaction. During the latter half of the year the revenue derived from it has exceeded expectations. Its adaptability to the most varied uses is sufficiently proved by its having been rented for lectures, concerts, dinners, poultry show, bazaars, exhibition of pictures, of dissolving views, speech-day gatherings, sales by auction of estates and pictures, election meetings, quadrille assemblies, and private balls.

8. The Hall has been found to be particularly well adapted for private balls. The perfect ventilation and admirable dancing floor have met with the entire approval of all present on these

occasions. Intimations have been received which warrant the belief that the Hall will be engaged for many private balls during the next season.

9. The Small Hall has been repaired and decorated, and is found of great use, especially in connection with the Large Hall. The spare rooms have also been frequently rented for small meetings, &c.

10. The public Kitchen has been furnished and fitted with large patent range, high-pressure steam boiler, steam plate-closet, dressers, &c., sufficient for the preparation of a dinner for 200 persons. There is an increasing demand for the accommodation which the kitchen affords.

11. In April last a deputation waited on His Excellency Sir George Bowen, who assented to the request that he would become patron of the institution, and desired that his name should be enrolled amongst the life members.

12. In May last the Committee came to the conclusion that the interests of the Institution demanded greater activity than Mr. Thompson's advanced years would permit. After consultation with Mr. Thompson on the subject, he tendered his resignation as Secretary conditionally upon a year's salary being awarded to him, to which terms, in consideration of Mr. Thompson's lengthened service, the Committee assented. The Committee further unanimously resolved to elect Mr. Thompson an honorary member of the Institution, which resolution was conveyed to him in the form of an illuminated address.

13. Advertisements calling for applications for the Secretaryship produced 115 candidates. After careful consideration the Committee selected Mr. Garnet Walch to fill the vacant office.

14. The desirableness of holding periodical soirées was referred to in last year's report. Several of these agreeable reunions were held towards the close of the year, and received increasing support on each succeeding occasion.
