REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

OF THE

MELBOURNE ATHENÆUM

FOR THE YEAR 1874.

1. The Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum now submit the Report of their proceedings during the past twelve months, together with Statement of Receipts and Expenditure.

2. Reference to the balance-sheet will show that the income during 1874 amounted to £2320 18s. 8d., being an increase of £305 7s. 2d. over the revenue for the previous year.

3. The Committee have satisfaction in stating that 547 new members joined the Institution, and that the total number at present on the roll amounts to 1354 members, comprised as follows, viz.:—Yearly and half-yearly members, 1236; life members, 104; honorary members, 14.

4. Particular attention has been bestowed upon the Library, and the Committee have not been sparing in devoting to it as large a portion of the income as possible. The number of books added in 1874 amounts to 1414, as against 705 in 1873, and the year's circulation shows an increase of 4843 volumes. The expenditure on the Library

and Reading Room has been £666 10s. 6d. in 1874, as against £401 14s. 11d. in 1873.

5. The Committee, feeling that it would add to the convenience of members and afford them increased opportunities of using the Library, procured the services of an assistant, and have thereby been enabled for some time past to open the Library daily (Saturdays excepted) without intermission, from 8.30 a.m. to 9 p.m., instead of at stated periods as previously. A supplementary catalogue of new books has just been printed and is now obtainable.

6. In the Reading Room the supply of newspapers and periodicals has been maintained at a high standard, and the Committee are glad to note the increasingly large attendance of members visiting the room.

7. Telegraphic notices of the arrivals and departures of Shipping are now posted three times daily in the Reading Room. This new feature will, no doubt, prove a great convenience to such members as are interested in commercial affairs.

8. The Classes have increased in number, the Committee having held out every encouragement for their formation and continuance, believing them to form one of the main objects of the Institution.

9. A series of excellent Lectures on Chemistry was commenced, but on account of the inadequate support given to them by the members and the public generally, they were discontinued. Several lectures on various subjects were given by public lecturers, to which, by arrangement, members were admitted at half the charge to the public.

10. The demand for the use of the Halls and Rooms has considerably increased during the year, the revenue from this source being upwards of £200 in excess of last year.

11. In accordance with a recommendation of the last Annual Meeting of members, the Committee elected Henry Biers, Esq., your late President, an honorary member, and presented him with this mark of your appreciation of his services on behalf of the Institution in the form of an illuminated and engrossed testimonial.

12. During the month of September the Committee received a requisition calling upon them to convene a meeting of the members to take into consideration the desirableness of opening the Reading Room on Sundays. In accordance with the requisition the meeting took place on October 12, and was attended by upwards of 500 members. The subject was discussed at great length, the proposal, on division, being negatived by a considerable majority.
