REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

OF THE

MELBOURNE ATHENÆUM

FOR THE YEAR 1875.

1. The Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum have much pleasure in presenting their Report of the transactions of the past twelve months.
2. The improvement in the position and prospects of the Institution, which the Committee reported last year, has been more than maintained during the year just closed.
3. There has been a steady rise in the revenue of the Institution. The receipts for 1875 amounted to £2778 12s. 1d., as against £2320 18s. 8d. for 1874; or an increase of £457 13s. 5d. for the year.
4. The total number of members on the roll is 1402, of whom 1287 are yearly and half-yearly subscribers, 101 life members, and 14 honorary members. The amount received for subscriptions during 1875 was £1241 5s., or £127 2s. 6d. in excess of 1874. During the year 480 new members were enrolled.

5. Especial attention has been devoted to the financial affairs of the Institution, and a system of judicious economy has resulted in the reduction of the bank overdraft from £642 16s. 11d. to £26 8s. 8d.

6. In consequence of the prosperous state of the Institution, it is proposed that the reduction of the mortgage debt of £7000 be commenced during the ensuing year by the inauguration of a sinking fund. Should the revenue continue as satisfactory as at present, there is every reason to believe that the gradual extinction of the debt will be the work of each succeeding year.

7. The amount paid during 1875 for books, newspapers, magazines, and binding was £533 1s. 11d., which, together with the sum of £177 11s. 7d. outstanding liability in connection with the said departments, makes a total of £710 13s. 6d. The number of volumes added to the Library was 657, and a quantity of additional magazines have been ordered from 1st January, 1876.

8. In September last a number of surplus, mutilated and duplicate works withdrawn from the Library, were sold by auction, realising the net amount of £32 15s. 4d.

9. Alterations have been made, extending the space available in both Reading Room and Library, and have met, it is believed, with the general approbation of the members. The attendance in the Reading Room has been uniformly large, and the circulation of works from the Library has increased from 39,729 to 45,002.

10. Every inducement has been offered for the establishment of classes. Those at present held are fairly attended. They comprise the following, viz., Italian, French, Chemistry,

Phonography, Singing, Dancing, the Subjects for the Civil Service and Matriculation Examinations, &c.

11. The Halls and Rooms have found frequent and remunerative occupants, the large Hall in particular having been liberally patronised for a variety of purposes. The revenue from this hall alone is £900 17s. 9d. for the twelve months, exceeding by nearly £350 the sum derived from the same source in 1874. The return for the small Lecture Hall is £172 6s. 8d., and for the rooms let for minor meetings, &c., £81 5s. 4d.

12. The Offices in the front of the building have been almost uninterruptedly tenanted throughout the year, realising a rental of £243 12s. 6d.


