REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

OF THE

MELBOURNE ATHENÆUM

FOR THE YEAR 1880.

The Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum submit the following Report:—

1. The transactions of the year have been of a satisfactory character. The total revenue amounts to £2598 16s. 1d., of which nearly £1500 is for subscriptions.

2. It has been decided to pay off £500 next June of the debt due on the real property of the Institution. To this end, the sum of £200 has been placed in the bank as a fixed deposit.

3. The number of subscribing members on the roll is nearly 1300. There are also 86 life members and 13 honorary members.

4. Continued care has been taken in making judicious additions to the Library. More than £450 has been spent for books and magazines, over £200 for newspapers, and over £100 for binding. The number of books added to the Library during the year is 543. A new edition of the Catalogue has been printed, revised to the 1st September.

5. The attendance in the Reading Room and News Room has been as large as during any preceding year. The number of works issued from the Library was over 36,000. The total number of visits to the Institution may be roughly estimated at 160,000, exclusive of those to the halls.

6. The revenue derived from the Large Hall is £537 17s. This is an improvement on last year, and may indeed be considered a good amount in view of the great competition

that now exists. The Small Hall has yielded £240 7s. For rent of class and meeting rooms the sum of £98 5s. 4d. has been received.

7. Under the present arrangement, no fees are received by the Institution from pupils attending classes, but in lieu thereof rent is paid by the teacher. The following classes are held:—Matriculation and Civil Service Classes by Messrs. I. Warren Ball and H. J. L. Batten; French, by Madame Last; Italian, by Signor Granata; Bookkeeping, by Mr. Dimelow; Fancy Work, by Miss Riordan.

There is a separate Reading Room for Ladies, supplied with suitable Newspapers and Periodicals. Subscription per annum, Ten Shillings.

The Library is divided into two departments—the Circulating Library and a Library of Reference. The former contains between 15,000 and 16,000 volumes, which are lent to members and their families. New works are being constantly added. To many the Library of Reference will be found of value, as it contains Files of Home and Colonial Newspapers for thirty years back; also such Works of Reference as Parliamentary Proceedings, Gazettes, Encyclopædias, Men of the Time, Directories, the best Etymological and Scientific Dictionaries, &c., &c.

The Reading Room is open daily from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., Sundays and Public Holidays excepted.

The Library is open from 8.30 a.m. to 9 p.m.

On Saturdays the Library is closed at 2 p.m.
