REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE MELBOURNE ATHENÆUM,

FOR THE YEAR 1885.

The concluding words of last year's Report were as follow:—"The Committee hope to be able in their next Report to congratulate the members on the possession of a building worthy of the Institution, an ornament to the city, and frequented by a largely increased number of members." Although the wish here expressed is not yet realised to the very letter, still the new building is rapidly approaching completion, and your Committee are sure that the members will agree with them in regarding this as a subject of legitimate congratulation.

A Special General Meeting of the members was held on 12th February, 1885. They were informed that tenders had been called for the erection of the building, but that none of them came within the amount sanctioned by the subscribers. It was then resolved that certain modifications should be made in the plans, and that fresh tenders should be called for. Another Special General Meeting was held 1st April, fresh plans were exhibited, and also a tender from Mr. Alexander Kemp to erect the proposed building for £10,485. At this meeting the following resolution was carried:—"Resolved that this meeting hereby authorises the General Committee to borrow the sum of £18,000 on the security of the real property of the Institution at a rate not exceeding $5\frac{3}{4}$ per cent. per annum, such sum to be expended as follows: £4000 to pay off the present mortgage, £11,000 in connection with the building, the balance for furniture, fittings, and other matters in connection with the Institution." This resolution was confirmed in accordance with the Rules, at a second meeting held 9th April.

The required loan was obtained through the exertions of Mr. H. R. Fuge, Honorary Treasurer, at $5\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. per annum interest, the term of the mortgage being for seven years. The contract for the new building was signed by the President, the Treasurer, and the Contractor on 30th April, 1885. As it would have been inconvenient to carry on the Library and Reading-room in the Large Hall during the erection of the new building, your Committee succeeded in renting temporary rooms in the building of the Equitable Co-operative Society. The Library was removed thereto, and the Contractor took possession of the old building 16th May. He has since carried on his work with despatch, and expects to complete it within the contract time which is the 1st April, 1886.

An agreement was made with the Contractor that the approach to the Large Hall was to be available during the progress of the work. He subsequently found that this arrangement interfered seriously with his operations. He therefore rented the Hall for two months so that it might be closed to the public. During the time that it was so closed, your Committee, with the permission of Mr. Kemp, had the hall re-decorated in a style which has met with universal approval.

The business of the Institution during the past year has been as successful as could have been expected under the circumstances. The gross receipts amount to £2359 7s. 4d. Of this amount, the subscriptions have yielded £1290 6s 6d. the Large Hall £623 8s., and the Small Hall £95 7s. 6d., the latter having been available only for four months. This shows a decrease of only £464 on last year's receipts.

The gross expenditure amounts to £10,855 9s. 8d. This includes £4000 paid as the balance of the former mortgage; also £3400 to the Contractor, £262 2s. 6d. to the Architects, £240 for decoration of the Hall, £195 6s. for rent of temporary rooms, £77 to the Clerk of Works, about £120 for legal and other incidental expenses in connection with

the building, and £638 10s. 1d. for interest. The expenditure for ordinary purposes amounted to about £1940, of which the principal items are: Salaries, £738 15s.; books, magazines, and newspapers, £600 17s. 4d.; gas and electric light, £158 14s. 11d.; repairs, furniture and fittings, £140 8s. 6d.; binding, £84 15s. 10d.

The number of books added to the Library was 680. The total number of books issued to the subscribers was 29,653, and 7200 magazines.

The Committee record with deep regret the death of the Honorable D. E. Wilkie, M.D., who was for 23 years Treasurer of the Institution. It may interest the Members to be informed that a testimonial, in the form of a beautifully illuminated address, which had been prepared for presentation to him on his retirement from the Treasurership, and which he refused on the broad principle that he did not approve of testimonials, was, after his death, handed over to his eldest son, by whom it was thankfully received, as a memento of his late father's long and disinterested services to the Institution.

The Committee regret also to record the death of Mr. Walter Thompson, which took place on the 12th February, 1885. Mr. Thompson was Secretary of the Institution from the year 1855 to the year 1873, when he resigned. He was then elected an honorary member of the Institution in consideration of his services. He became a member of the Committee in the year 1878, and continued on it till the year 1883, when he was elected President.

There have been 11 ordinary and 7 special meetings of the Committee during the year.




