Copies of the Balance Sheet were circulated among the subscribers, & it was taken as read

The Committee have great pleasure in presenting to the members the report for the past year, from which it will be seen that the Institution continues to progress in prosperity and usefulness.

The gross receipts for the year amount to £4572 5s. 3d. and the expenditure to £3423 11s., showing a profit of £1148 14s. 3d. on the year, and making our credit balance in cash amount to £2878 1s. 6d., of which £2525 is deposited at good interest.

The following are the details of the receipts:—Subscriptions, £1591 19s.; rent of front shops, £1165; rent of large hall, £1150 5s. 10d.; small hall, £301 16s.; rooms, £274 2s. 9d.; interest, £62 10s.; sales, £26 11s. 8d.

The principal items in expenditure are:—Interest on mortgage, £990; salaries and wages, £972 15s.; books, magazines and newspapers, £592 19s. 1d.; repairs and furniture, £73 13s. 9d.; gas, £250 10s. 9d.; rates, £136 10s.; binding, £67 14s. 3d.

The total number of members is 1535, of whom 355 joined during the year.

The number of books added to the Library was 618; the total number of works issued to subscribers was 29,697, and 7108 magazines.
