The decrease in these two items is, no doubt, to be attributed to the prevailing financial depression and to the fact of one of the shops being vacant for some time. The amount received for the Large Hall is very satisfactory, especially in view of the great competition that exists owing to the increased number of similar places of entertainment. REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

Melbourne Athenaeum,

For the Year 1891.

The Committee of the Melbourne Athenaeum submit their report of the transactions of the past year.

The revenue of the year has been satisfactory as a whole, and has exceeded by £75 that of 1890.

It will be seen from the Balance Sheet that the gross receipts for the year amount to £4072 8s. 6d., and the expenditure to £3495 14s. 1d., giving the satisfactory balance of £576 14s. 5d., and bringing the total credit balance up to £4617 10s., of which sum £4225 is deposited at interest.

The following are the receipts:—Subscriptions, £1330 11s.; rent of front shops, £1009; rent of large hall, £911 15s.; small hall, £308 5s.; rooms, £311 1s. 5d.; interest, £182; sale of papers and catalogues, £19 16s. 1d.

The principal items of expenditure are:—Salaries and wages, £1060 10s.; interest on mortgage, £990; books, magazines and newspapers, £654 9s. 5d.; lighting, £294; 12s. 10d.; rates, £138; repairs and furniture, £100 17s. 9d.; binding, £90 16s. 3d.

The number of members on the roll is 1381, of whom 237 joined during the year.

The number of books added to the Library during the year was 640; the total number of works issued to subscribers was 30,441, and 7083 magazines.

The Committee record with deep regret the death of Mr. Alderman Moubray, one of the Trustees. He was one of the oldest members of the Institution, always took a deep interest in its progress, and helped it in various ways, among which special mention should be made of the gift of the statue of Minerva, which adorns the façade of the building. They have also been deprived by death of the valuable services of Mr. Henry R. Fuge, who was a member of the Committee from the year 1867, was Treasurer for several years, and was a past President of the Institution; also of those of Mr. R. S. Danson, who was a member of the Committee for four successive years.

The vacancy on the Trust, caused by the death of Mr. Moubray, was filled by the election of Mr. Henry Meeks, one of the oldest members of the Committee. This election will have to be confirmed by you.

The vacancy on the Committee caused by the election of Mr. Ridley as Vice-President, was filled by the election of Mr. Martin Hood.

The President, Vice-President, Treasurer, and the following members of the Committee retire from office, but are eligible for re-election, viz.:—Messrs. Callaway, Hood, Ievers, Iliffe, Levi, and Sangster. There are also vacancies caused by the election of Mr. Meeks as Trustee, and by the death of Mr. Danson.

the title as it now stands.

Your sub-committee have given most mature consideration to the whole matter, and have received most valuable assistance from the Vice President, Mr Downward, who obtained a plan giving the measurements of all the various portions of the property originally vested in the Partition, and showing the various alienations and encroachments. Plan of the Land of the Institution.

The annexed plan shows the property of the Melbourne Atheneum. The portion coloured pink indicates the land on which the Institution stands. This was brought in under the act by Survey without Survey. The portion coloured blue, forming the rest of the estate, was brought in under the act by Survey. The fee of the part coloured brown remains in Trustees under the old law, but has not been brought under the act.

The whole of Lots Nos 2 and 3 Section 11 of the town and parish of Melbourne formerly belonged to the Institution. They were subdivided into lots with rights of way between them, and certain lots were sold with easement over the rights of way.

Application was made in July 1881 by an Trustee to bring the whole of the Right of Way under the act. The Registrar of Titles refused to accept the notice of application to be admitted unless the Southern rectangular portion of the right of way (coloured brown on the plan) were excised. The said portion was subsequently excised by the Trustees, with the consent of the General Committee of the Institution. The advertisement of the application then appeared, and a "Caveat" was lodged by the Victoria Coffee Palace Co. against the above rectangular strip coloured brown on plan. By direction of our Trustees, a Survey of the right of way was then made by Mr Huntly, and, as it appeared that all encroachment had been made by the Coffee Palace Co. who had built on to the triangular strip, the Committee was considered by the Solicitors of the Company and those of the Committee. A report was made to our General Committee who anticipated our solicitors to do what they could best for the interest of our Institution.

It was thereupon decided to accept the title to the Right of Way as it

now stands, and as shown on the plan by the part coloured blue.

The whole matter of the title to the right of way was minutely and exhaustively investigated by the House Committee on 17th July 1892. They found that, according to the statements received from our solicitors and the information obtained from the Survey Office, we have forfeited our right to the land forming the southern portion of the right of way (coloured brown on plan) by allowing it to be adversely occupied for over the statutory period without taking any action to assert our rights and title to the same. They also found that it is now useless to make an application to the Survey Office for the issue of a certificate of title for the said land.

It was resolved that the plan, kindly made by Mr. Downward, should be kept in the archives of the Society, and that this précis should accompany any it.
