The Balance Sheet for the past year has been under our consideration, and the Secretary has also laid before us a tabulated statement of the items of receipts & expenditure for the past five years. For the first time in many years the expenditure is in excess of the receipts. This is caused, not by any increase in the expenditure, which has been below the average, but by a shrinkage in the receipts which has occurred chiefly in the subscriptions and in the rent received for the front shops & the rooms. The revenue from the two Halls has been fairly good. The Committee think that bearing in mind what we all know about the general depression, there need be no uneasiness about the temporary drop in the receipts. A little extra economy in the expenditure will probably enable us to keep the balance on the right side during the present year, and brighter times will restore us our former prosperous condition. #### REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

OF THE

### Melbourne Athenæum,

For the Year 1892.

The Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum submit their report of the transactions of the past year.

The revenue has not been so satisfactory as in former years; but, bearing in mind the continued dulness in financial matters, the shrinkage is no more than was to be expected.

From the accumulated savings of preceding years, the sum of £4000 has been paid off the mortgage on the real

property of the Institution, reducing the amount from £18,000 to £14,000, which has been borrowed at the reduced interest of 5 per cent. per annum.

The following are the items of the receipts:—Subscriptions, £110 3s. 6d.; rent of front shops, £770; rent of large hall, £728 15s.; rent of small hall, £205 11s.; rooms, £140 15s.; interest, £208 11s. 5d.; sale of papers and catalogues, £14 11s. 6d.

The principal items of expenditure are:—Salaries and wages, £1073 10s.; interest on mortgage, £845; books, magazines and newspapers, £639 1s. 4d.; lighting, £296 7s. 3d.; rates, £139 2s. 6d.; binding, £110 14s. 6d.; repairs, goods, and furniture, £117 19s. 5d.

The number of members on the roll is 1198, of whom 186 joined during the year.

The number of books added to the Library during the year was 652; the total number of works issued to subscribers was 30,319, and 7121 magazines.
