### Melbourne Athenæum,

For the Year 1894.

The Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum submit their report of the transactions of the past year.

They regret there is still a falling off in the receipts, caused mainly by the reduced rent of the front shops and the fewer lettings of the two halls and the rooms.

Notwithstanding the reduction made in the staff of officers and assistants, referred to in last Report, the expenditure is greater than the receipts, and this fact will require to receive the attention of the Committee.

The following are the items of receipts:—Subscriptions, £942 13s.; rent of front shops, £585; rent of large hall, £374 13s.; rent of small hall, £130 12s.; rent of rooms, £79 2s. 6d.; sale of papers and catalogues, £16 17s. 6d.; interest, £13 10s.

The principal items of expenditure are:—Salaries and wages, £800 4s. 6d.; interest on mortgage, £700; books, magazines and newspapers, £541 1s. 1d.; lighting, £253 18s.; rates, £125 2s. 6d.; binding, £56 9s. 3d.; insurance, £36 0s. 6d.; repairs, goods, &c., £32 2s. 2d.

The number of members on the roll is 945, of whom 123 joined during the year.

The number of books added to the Library during the year was 627; the total number of works issued to subscribers was 27,880, and 6983 magazines.

Your Committee beg to report that the Treasurer

and Secretary waited on our Solicitor, Mr Wisewould, for the purpose of obtaining information with reference to the existing mortgage and the proposal to borrow a further sum of £1000.

Mr Wisewould states that the existing mortgage is a deed of extension of the original mortgage of £18,000 in which it is set forth that the sum of £4000 has been paid off, thus reducing the mortgage to £14,000; that the rate of interest is reduced from 5½ to 5 per cent per annum, conditions as in the original mortgage. New mortgage to expire 30th June 1897.

Mr Wisewould is of opinion that, to obtain a further advance, a new mortgage would be required.

To borrow under mortgage for other purposes than those set forth in the rules, it would be necessary to pass a new rule giving power to borrow for said purposes.

With reference to obtaining a Bank overdraft, he does not consider it to be necessary to alter the Rules.

He sees no legal objection to asking the Trustees of the Sumner Estate to allow the Interest to stand over until the expiry of the mortgage, paying interest on it as well as on the principal.

(The continuation of the Report was read by the President, as the Secretary was not present at that portion of the meeting of the sub Committee.)

It is recommended to the General Committee that the following reduction be made in Salaries and Wages from the 1<sup>st</sup> July next:

Mr Curtis (Secretary) from £315 to £200 per annum

Mr Smith, Librarian, £247.10 to £160 - -

Sam (Cantaker) £128 to £78 - .

With these reductions, and allowing £52 for additional help in caretaking and cleaning, and the Lad's salary remaining at £26 as before, the expenses in this direction will be reduced to £516 as against £763.14 as at present; thus effecting a saving of £247 per annum.

Your Committee suggest these reductions with regret, hoping that a more favourable state of our finances may, in a not very distant future, warrant the reconsideration of the salaries in a more favourable direction.

We recommend that the Treasurer be authorised to

negotiate with a Bank to obtain financial assistance to the extent of £2000 to cover all requirements to the maturity of the existing Mortgage; and should he fail in this that the subscribers be asked to authorise the borrowing of a further £2000 on a further Mortgage to be co-terminous with the present one.

Secondly we recommend that the question of the hour of attendance of the various employés be referred to the House Committee for re-arrangement."

The President moved the adoption of the Report, which was seconded by Mr Duff.

The Treasurer informed the Committee that he had ascertained that the executors of the Sumner Estate would not consent to an arrangement by which the interest would be allowed to accumulate till the expiry of the mortgage.

The Report having received very attentive consideration, was adopted.

He thought this unfair on the part of Mr Lush; He said that if Mr Newmould had had the courtesy to submit the draft of the Mortgage to him, the alteration would have been made & the delay not arisen.

Mr Lush & Mr Rennie informed the Committee of the steps they had taken in order to have Mr Gibbs's objections to sign the mortgage removed. They had seen Mr Egerton, the Solicitor for the Sumner Estate, and he informed them that the mortgage had been drawn on lines identical to
