REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

OF THE

Melbourne Athenæum,

FOR THE YEAR 1896.



THE Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum submit their report of the transactions of the past year.

There is a slight improvement in the receipts, and a saving has been made in the expenditure, without, however, curtailing the amount spent for books, magazines, and newspapers.

The gross receipts amount to £2117 17s. 6d., and the expenditure to £2280 11s. 5d.

The following are the receipts for the year:—Subscriptions, £815 11s. 6d.; rent of front shops, £537 5s.; large hall, £507 3s.; small hall, £129 15s.; rooms, £113 13s. 9d.; sales, £14 9s. 3d.

The items of expenditure are:—Interest on mortgage, £787 10s.; salaries and wages, £510 16s.; books, magazines, and newspapers, £401 12s. 1d.; gas and electric

light, £250 15s. 1d.; rates, £119 5s.; repairs, goods, &c., £98 10s. 8d.; binding, £37 7s. 1d.; insurance, £36 0s. 6d.; postage, stationery, and petty cash, £17 10s. 6d.; advertising and printing, £17 0s. 6d.; auditors, £4 4s.

The large hall has been partially renovated, and some improvements have been made in the library fittings.

The number of members on the roll is 832, of whom 105 joined during the year.

The number of books added to the library during the year was 477; the total number of works issued to subscribers was 25,810, and 5960 magazines.



A conference of Librarians was held, by invitation of the Trustees of the Public Library, on the 21st April, 1896, and the three following days. Your Committee sent as Delegates to it Mr. Lush, Dr. Jamieson, and Mr. Harlin, and also the Secretary and Librarian. Several useful papers were read, and some interesting discussions took place. It was resolved to form an association, to be called the Library Association of Australasia. Officers were elected, and it was decided to hold the next meeting at Sydney in Easter week.

It is hoped that the current year may bring at least a slight renewal of prosperity, in which the Institution may share. Those members who take a real interest in the progress of the Athenæum are earnestly invited to endeavour to bring in new members, as this will be a substantial help in making the receipts at least cover the expenditure.
