Gentlemen,

Having been requested by the Library Committee to answer a series of questions from the General Committee with reference to the books of the Library, I beg to state:

1. The last general checking of the books took place in the year 1876. The whole of the Library was then re-arranged, and a new Catalogue was printed.
2. The number of books then in the Library was about sixteen thousand.

sixteen thousand.

3. Since then there has been an average of about 600 books added yearly.

4. In the year 1875, a very large number of old books and of duplicate works was withdrawn from the Library, and sold for £ 22. 15. 4.

Since that time, no books have been sold. The mutilated books have, by order of the General Committee, been donated to the various charitable Institutions, the number so disposed of being about equal to the additions during the year.

5. The estimated number of books now in the Library is about 16,000.

The Librarian laid before as the result of a calculation that he had made of the number of books added to and taken from the Library during the ten years last past, from this it appears that 2651 works (representing 3920 volumes) had been added during that period, and that 2018 works (representing 2510 parts) had been withdrawn. The Librarian showed the Committee his manuscript copy of the Catalogue and of the additions thereto. He stated that he goes periodically through his ledger to ascertain if any borrowed books had not been returned.

Your Committee are of opinion that the Library records are well & faithfully kept, and that it is almost impossible for a book to be lost without the knowledge of the Librarian.
