Indeed, it would seem indispensable to them, as it is their only means of communicating with the rooms in their building on the eastern side of our right-of-way. We have allowed them to use this overhead Passage without charge, because they were paying £20 per annum for the subway. Your Committee have consulted our Surveyors and have ascertained from them that we can compel them to remove the Overhead Passage or else pay rent for the space it occupies. It is, therefore, recommended that a rent of £20 per year be charged for the space occupied by the Overhead Passage, and one pound per annum for the underground Passage.

Accounts amounting to £29. 14. 0 have been examined & found correct.

It was moved by Mr Jiffie & Mr Ridley that the Report be adopted.

Mr Rennie pointed out that the rent for the accommodation would thus be increased by a pound a year. He thought that, rather than make such a trifling increase, it would be better to charge the old amount of £20 per annum as rent for the two Passages, and to treat them as one affair.
