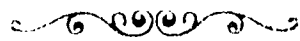


REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE
OF THE
Melbourne Athenæum,
FOR THE YEAR 1900.



THE Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum submit their report of the transactions of the past year.

The gross receipts of the year amount to £2150 12s. 10d., and the expenditure to £2112 9s. 7d. The details are given in the Balance Sheet appended to this Report.

The number of members on the roll is 668, of whom 88 joined during the year.

The number of volumes added to the library during the year was 201; the total number of works issued to subscribers was 20,553, and 5507 magazines.

The President, Vice-President, Treasurer, and the following Members of Committee retire from office, but are eligible for re-election, viz.:—Messrs. Callaway, Carr, Downward, Harlin, Lush, Rusden, and Wilson. Mr. Wilson does not seek re-election.

Members are reminded that they may make nominations to fill the vacancies at the end of the Annual Meeting. The attendance at this meeting has frequently been very meagre. It is hoped there will be an improvement in this respect at the meeting which is to be held on Wednesday, 30th January, 1901. To help to effect this change, the Committee resolved to send in advance a copy of the Annual Report to each of the members.

On 27th April, 1900, the Committee sent a circular to each of the members, in which the financial position of the Institution was shown. It was pointed out that there had been, during the past five years, an average deficit of £200 per annum, and that a continuance of such a state of affairs must soon lead to the closing of the Institution which had done such good work for so many years. There has been a slight improvement during the year just terminated, but much care will still be necessary in order to guard against serious injury to the Institution.

Each member is earnestly invited to be present at the Annual Meeting on 30th January, and to assist the Committee in adopting means that will be efficacious in continuing the existence of the Melbourne Athenæum.
