THE Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum submit their report of the transactions of the past year.

The gross receipts of the year amount to £1995 12s. 1d., and the expenditure to £2039 1s. The details are given in the Balance Sheet appended to this Report.

The number of members on the roll is 620, of whom 61 joined during the year.

The number of volumes added to the library during the year was 140; the total number of works issued to subscribers was 18,008, and 5148 magazines.


