

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE
OF THE
Melbourne Athenæum,
FOR THE YEAR 1905.

THE Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum submit their report of the transactions of the past year.

The gross receipts of the year amount to £2559 17s., and the expenditure to £2282 7s. The details are given in the Balance Sheet appended to this Report, a reference to which will show that the cash balance and fixed deposits at the closing of the accounts amounted to £1085 19s. 8d., an increase during the year of £277 10s., also that the balance payable on account of sewer connections, £154 16s., has been liquidated.

The number of members on the roll is 505, of whom 47 joined during the year.

The number of volumes added to the library during the year was 138. The total number of works issued to subscribers was 14,097, and 5008 magazines.


