THE Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum submit their report of the transactions of the year 1908.

The gross receipts of the year amount to £2584 18s. 4d. and the expenditure is £2059 10s. 11d.

The credit balance in the bank is £186 15s., and fixed deposits of £1100 in the bank of New South Wales, and £650 in the Bank of Australasia.

The number of members on the roll is 452, of whom 28 joined during the year.

The number of volumes added to the library during the year was 138. The total number of works issued to subscribers was 11,091, and 4201 magazines.
