REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE
OF THE
MELBOURNE ATHENÆUM,
FOR THE YEAR 1910,

*To be submitted to the Members at the General Meeting
Wednesday, 25th January, 1911, at 8 p.m.*

THE Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum submit
their report of the transactions of the year 1910.

The gross receipts of the year amount to £2685 19s. 1d.
and the expenditure is £2725 18s. 5d.

The credit balance in the bank is £905 13s. 10d., and there
are fixed deposits of £550 in the Bank of New South
Wales, and £900 in the Bank of Australasia.

The number of members on the roll is 460, of whom
14 are life members, and 57 joined during the year.

The number of volumes added to the library during the year was 210. The total number of works issued to subscribers was 11,140, and 3822 magazines. During the year the books in the Library have been re-scheduled, and a card catalogue is in preparation, and is nearing completion.

Members are reminded that they may make nominations to fill the vacancies at the close of the Annual Meeting (which the members are earnestly requested to attend), to be held on Wednesday, 25th January, 1911.

The Committee regretfully report that during the year the Institution lost, by death, the valuable services of Mr. Thomas Rooke, who had been a member of the Institution since 1884, and was an energetic and useful member of the Committee.

The Committee during the year accepted, with regret, the resignation of Mr. T. Hamilton as a member of the Committee.

During the year extensive alterations and improvements have been effected, and the Committee has let tenders for further improvements, which are now being carried out.

The want of a central art gallery in Melbourne led your Committee to the belief that the Upper Hall could be converted into an up-to-date picture gallery, by the erection of a lantern light roof. The work was carried out by Messrs. Spargo and Taylor, Contractors, under the supervision of Messrs. Sydney Smith and Ogg, Architects, and has proved most successful. The Victorian Artist's Society, Messrs. Walter Withers, Bernard Hall, and T. C. Lothian, held exhibitions in the gallery last spring, and there are numerous lettings already booked for the coming art season.

A new fire-proof biograph chamber has been erected at the back of the gallery, thus providing increased seating accommodation, and complying to the full with the requirements of the Board of Public Health.

Your Committee has felt that in order to provide more comfortable accommodation for Members, a smoking room should be provided, easily accessible from the reading room. The Architects, Messrs. Sydney Smith and Ogg, have prepared plans, and a contract having been let to Mr. J. Pittard, Contractor, the work is now being done. The new room, which will be ready for occupation at the beginning of March, will be L-shape, one arm being 24 ft. x 12 ft., the other 20 ft. x 10 ft. The room will be well lighted and ventilated, and comfortably furnished, and will be stocked with newspapers and magazines. The contract also provides for the renovation and ventilation of the reading room.

Members are invited to assist the Committee in making the smoking room a success, by inducing their friends to join the Institution.
