REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE
OF THE
MELBOURNE ATHENÆUM,
FOR THE YEAR 1914.

*To be submitted to the Members at the General Meeting,
Wednesday, 27th January, 1915, at 8 p.m.*

THE Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum submit their report of the transactions of the year 1914, which is the seventy-fifth in the history of the Institution.

The Committee regretfully report the death of Mr. W. H. Thodey, who was elected your Vice-President at the last annual meeting. He had been a member of the Institution for thirty-three years, and had been an active member of the Committee. The following minute has been recorded in the books of the Institution :—

“The Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum deeply regrets the death of its Vice-President, Mr. W. H. Thodey, and desires to place on record its appreciation of his services to the Institution, of which he has been a member since 1881. As a member of the General, Finance, and Library Committees, Mr. Thodey’s advice and knowledge were invaluable, and his loss will be severely felt.”

Mr. H. M. Knight was elected to the vacancy as Vice-President on June 5.

The Committee also have to chronicle with regret the death of Mr. C. L. Andrews, a member of the Committee. The following minute has been placed on the records of the Institution :—

“The Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum desires to express its deep sympathy with Mrs. Andrews and her son in their sad bereavement, and to inform them that the Committee very greatly deplores the loss of a valued colleague.”

The gross receipts for the year amount to £2875 15s. 1d. The gross expenditure amounts to £2967 7s. 11d., but of this £408 7s. 9d. was spent in improvements. Thus the ordinary expenditure may be stated as £2559 0s. 2d.

The credit balance in the bank is £185 4s.

The number of members on the roll is 522, of whom 12 are life members, and 93 joined during the year.

The Committee is pleased to be able to report that there is again an increase in the number of members on the roll, the total, 522, being the largest since 1903. The subscriptions paid are £11 10s. in excess of 1913, and the highest since 1905. Early in the year satisfactory buying arrangements were made, with the result that though there were many more books and magazines purchased, the cost was materially reduced. The extra supply of magazines has been much appreciated by members, the number issued during the year being a large increase on 1913.

The Committee carried out the work of providing new conveniences in the basement, and the comfort of the alterations has given general satisfaction, not only to members, but to the public attending entertainments in the Hall. The erection of lockers in the lavatory has also been appreciated. Most of the lockers have been let, but there are still a few available. The alterations have greatly added to the comfort of the smoking room, which has been much more generally used than in former years.

The Committee during the year had to deal with the matter of other buildings on the eastern boundary of the Institution. They have established the right to light and ventilation, with the result that an easement for light has been secured at the points required.

The Committee have great satisfaction in reporting that the mortgage on the real property of the Institution, which in 1912 was reduced from £16,000 to £14,000 and fell due on June 30, 1914, was successfully placed by your Treasurer

for seven years. The thanks of the Institution are due to Mr. Rennie for his good offices in this matter.

The number of volumes added to the library during the year was 500. The total number of works issued to subscribers was 14,373, and 9,260 magazines.
