REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE
OF THE
MELBOURNE ATHENÆUM,
FOR THE YEAR 1915.

*To be submitted to the Members at the General Meeting,
Wednesday, 26th January, 1916, at 8 p.m.*

THE Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum submit their report of the transactions of the year 1915, which is the seventy-sixth in the history of the Institution.

The Committee regretfully report the death of Mr. R. G. Kent, a former President, who was for many years a member of the Committee.

The gross receipts for the year amount to £2,488 0s. 11d. The gross expenditure amounts to £2,665 6s. 10d., but of this sum, £140 was spent in improvements, which produces an increased rental of £26 per annum. The war is responsible for the falling off in the revenue of the large Hall, which shows a decrease of £222 10s. 6d., and of the small Hall, which is £218 12s. less than in 1914. The war caused the abandonment of Art Exhibitions in the Upper Hall, only the Australian Art Association and Messrs. Hans Heysen and W. B. McInnes taking seasons as against a dozen exhibitions in 1914.

Your Committee allowed a committee of Melbourne artists to have the use of the Art Gallery free of charge for an exhibition of pictures, the whole of the proceeds being handed over to the Red Cross Society. The result was that over £600 was raised. Your Committee also gave the main

Hall free of charge to the promoters of a Jumble Fair, which realised over £300 to the Red Cross funds ; and in several other instances substantial reductions were made in the rentals to those giving entertainments for one or other of the patriotic funds.

There has been a gratifying increase in the members' roll and in the amount received from subscriptions. The amount received from this source is £540 12s., an increase of £47 12s. 6d. over the previous year, and the highest recorded since 1902. There are now 605 members on the roll, of whom 12 are life members. The number of new members enrolled during the year is 136. Your Committee have during the year effected many improvements in the Library and Reading Room, and the result has been highly satisfactory.

Since the outbreak of war, the demand for magazines has greatly increased. This is specially so with regard to reviews. Your Committee had the matter under consideration, and increased supplies have been obtained, and the demand is now met. The war books include the best of those published from month to month. Your Committee has been able to send several large parcels of magazines to the Australian troops in the tropics and to those on transports bound for Egypt.

The Librarian, Mr. W. H. Remfry, joined the expeditionary forces in February, 1915, and was appointed to the Army Medical Corps. Your Committee granted him twelve months' leave of absence without pay, but voted him an honorarium of £25. Mr. J. B. Cooper was appointed Acting-Librarian in Mr. Remfry's stead, and he entered on his duties early in February. Mr. Cooper has shown himself indefatigable in the interests of the Library and of the Institution.

The number of volumes added to the Library during the year was 525. The total number of works issued to subscribers was 14,482 books and 9,564 magazines.
