Gentlemen,

I desire to approach you again regarding the term of the lease granted to me. In so doing I wish once more to express my gratification at the cordial relations which have existed between the Trustees and myself and to ask that my previous letter may be withdrawn. It was written at a time when the financial responsibilities of the whole transaction were weighing very heavily and I could not see my way out of the difficulties.

I realise that the Trustees have treated me very generously in the past, but in view of the very large sum it has been necessary to spend to produce what everyone admits is a perfect theatre, while at the same time considerably enhancing the value of the Trustees' property, I think I am entitled to crave your indulgence and to place before you some facts which I feel would justify you in granting my application for a further extension.

I would remind you that from July 1922 until December 1924, a period of almost 22 years, I was paying the full rent under the lease and, allowing for the small amounts received in rent, this entailed a loss of £2434/11/8. During that time the arrangements of my Architect and Contractor were so complete that the members of the Athenaeum were put to as little inconvenience as possible. Where necessary work was done at night, double rates of wages having to be paid, so that your staircases might be kept clear and the conduct of your business not impeded. In all this I have to acknowledge the material assistance and advice tendered at all times by your Architect Mr. Sydney Smith.

The plans for the alterations grew as the work proceeded and it became necessary to make elaborate amendments and extensions to conform to requirements of the Board of Health and the City Council Building regulations. It was a difficult proposition, rendered more difficult by the fact that the main consideration was the safety of your building and the preserving of the identity of the Athenaeum so that it should not be overshadowed by the theatre. The Architects realised that in order to complete the work as it should be done expense must not be spared, with the result that, though we set out to spend £22,500, more than £7,000 beyond the sum I deposited by way of guarantee, the total cost has amounted to £51,566 in addition to

As you will see, the establishment of raw Lavatories for your members cost £633/13/- and I think you will agree that the accommodation provided is far better than it was before. The new smoking room or chess room cost £1012/6/9 exclusive of lighting and smoking, a considerable proportion of this sum was caused by defects in the building, e.g., the skylight had to be practically renewed as it was dangerous, and the wall over portion of the old smoking room had to be reconstructed at an extra cost of £342.

When the contractors took over the building they found that the drainage system was obsolete and badly in need of repair and this cost £138/9/8 to put in order.

When the floor of the old Hall was taken up and the necessary excavations made, it was found that the eastern wall was leaking and it cost £269/15/- tonmake it waterproof. The south wall of the theatre required extra underpinning (a fact not disclosed by your plans) at a cost of £126/7/3.

These are a few of the items but I would further direct your attention to the fact that it was no easy matter to provide the character and dignity that were necessary for your entrance, as distinct from that for the theatre, while at the same time preserving the stability of the building.
