There was a profit on the year's working of £1065/1/6. With the £142/7/11 brought forward, and 219 £500 received from the City Council in connection with the resumption of light areas, there remained a balance of £1565/1/6. Your Committee was thus able to pay £1000 off the mortgage, thereby reducing it to £10,000.

The most gratifying feature of the statement is the continued increase in members' subscriptions (£71/4/5). On the expenditure side, your Committee has been able to allocate £1583/6/8 for books, magazines and newspapers—an increase of £29/3/7 over the figures for 1926.

THE NEW TOWN HALL.
