THE Committee of the Melbourne Athenæum submits its report of the transactions of the year 1929, which is the ninetieth since the foundation of the Institution.

Mr. F. A. Campbell resigned from the Committee on October 4 on account of ill-health. An appreciation of his services was recorded in the minutes.

Major W. Bolton was elected a member of the Committee on December 6, and, in accordance with the rules, submits himself for re-election.

Mr. Thomson and Mr. Pietzcker were both absent for several months on leave.

The Finance Committee—Messrs. Rennie (chairman), Bates, Thomson, Hall, Wigg, Masters, Cameron, Campbell, and the President; the Library Committee—Messrs. Topp (chairman), Lush, Rennie, Greenwood, Burr, Lillie, Col. Williams, Dr. Kennison and the President; the House Committee—Messrs. Rennie, Masters, Meudell, Dillon, Thomson, Lillie, Dr. Kennison, and the President, held the usual meetings, and thus attended regularly to the various departments of the Institution.

The President, Vice-President, Treasurer, and the following members of the Committee, who are eligible for re-election, retire from office, viz., Messrs. Hall, Masters, Meudell, Dr. Kennison, Lieut.-Col. Williams, the Rev. D. A. Cameron and Major Bolton.

FINANCIAL.

The statement of accounts, submitted herewith, shows that the gross receipts for the year amounted to £7517 4/8, an increase of £144/5/11 over the previous year. The gross expenditure was £7250/14/4, an increase of £771/1/3. This increase is mainly due to the fact that for the first time the Institution has been assessed for Federal Land Tax, the amount paid being £659/17/2. Reference to this matter is made later. The amount spent on the purchase of books, magazines and newspapers is £128/7/11 more than in 1928, and binding, including the new process designed to give longer life to

books, is £86/4/2 more than before. With the amount brought forward, £458/7/2, there remained a balance of £724/17/6, a surplus on the year's working of £266/10/4.

The gratifying feature of the statement is the continued increase in members' subscriptions, £145/1/-.

The mortgage to the Australian Mutual Provident Society, for £9000 at 6½ per cent., fell due on July 1, 1929. Your Committee is pleased to report that it was able to renew the mortgage for a further term of five years at the reduced rate of 6 per cent.

As an indication of the steady progress of the Institution, the following table, showing the receipts from subscriptions, the amount spent on books, magazines and newspapers, and the gross receipts for the last ten years will be interesting, thus:—

LAND TAX.

Your Committee regrets to report that the property of the Institution has been assessed for Federal Land Tax, involving an annual payment of £493/19/9. In April, 1911, when the Federal Land Tax was introduced, the then Commissioner ruled that "the Melbourne Athenaeum is exempt from taxation under the Land Tax Assessment Act 1910"; a recent amended ruling of the

Federal Land Tax Commissioner that "exemption can only be claimed where no part of the building is leased or rented to persons other than the Institute" has been made, and on this ruling the Commissioner assessed the property of the Institution. Your Committee combated the arguments of the Commissioner for two years, holding that the Act was never intended to apply to institutions such as ours, but in the end, though supported by the able assistance and advice of the Taxpayers' Association, to which body the thanks of the Institution are due, and after exhausting every means in its power, the tax had to be paid under protest. Your Committee hopes that an amendment of the Commissioner's ruling may, sooner or later, be obtained, so that such portions of the premises, as are used exclusively for the purposes of the Institution, may be exempt.

LIFT.

Your Committee has had under consideration for many years the advisability of installing an electric lift, which would provide access to the Reading Room and Library and to the Art Gallery. Numerous suggestions were made, but none of these were feasible until a scheme was propounded, which seemed to overcome all the objections previously made. Your Committee examined the proposal most carefully, and the architects, Messrs. Sydney Smith, Ogg and Serpell, prepared plans and specifications, and the scheme was developed whereby a lift may be erected in the light area on the west side of the building at the rear of the shop occupied by M. Moffitt Pty. Ltd. The entrance to the proposed lift will be from the stalls entrance to the theatre, and it was necessary to obtain the consent of the lessees (Frank Talbot Proprietary Limited). The proposal was made to them that they should allow the members of the Athenaeum to use the stalls entrance (over which

the lessees had the exclusive right). The lessees met a sub-committee of the Institution in conference in a friendly spirit and offered to forego their exclusive right on consideration that the Trustees should grant them an extension of their lease for five years at the increased rental provided in the lease. Your Committee, at a special meeting, accepted the offer, and the necessary arrangements are now being made to put the work in hand. The advantage of a lift cannot be over-stated. Your Committee feels that the lift will afford greatly increased facilities to members, and that not only will the membership increase, but that the patrons of the Art Gallery will be greatly benefited. The architects—Messrs. Sydney Smith, Ogg and Serpell—have been instructed to make arrangements to proceed with the work.

ART GALLERY.

The popularity of the Art Gallery has been maintained. Exhibitors succeeded one another from February 24 to December 21. The exhibitors were Misses Jo. Sweatman, Annie Gates, M. McClintock, W. Rowell, A. E. Newbury, J. Hennessy, Twenty Melbourne Painters, the Women's Art Club, and the Australian Art Association.

Your Committee is pleased to report that there is not a vacant date for the gallery for this year, and that many bookings for 1931 have been made already.

THE LIBRARY.

The Library and Reading Room still continue to be most attractive, and the steady increase in membership is not only gratifying, but a distinct proof of their popularity. On several occasions members have expressed

their satisfaction with the excellent provision made for them, and of the competence and courtesy of the Library Staff.

Your Committee is pleased to report that the attendance of members in the evening and on public holidays is still increasing. The increase in the number of country subscribers, many of whom live a long distance from the city, still continues.
