It was arranged at the Conference between you and my sub-Committee on the 30th ulto. that you would endeavour to let me have for the consideration of my Committee an amended proposal not later than this morning.

At our Conference you mentioned that reductions in rent had been made by my Trustees to the tenants of the shops facing Collins Street. It was pointed out to you, however, that each of the tenants established a case of hardship by submitting proper balance sheets and trading accounts from which it was shown that the tenants were unable to carry on without a reduction of rent.

In the case of yourselves the Trustees have so far not been able to see ground for a reduction of rent on the basis of the valuation contemplated by the Landlord & Tenant (Rent Reduction) Act. but it may be that you consider there should be a reduction on the ground of Financial Emergency and reduction in expenditure.

The last date before which the Trustees must take steps under the Act to protect their position is rapidly approaching and for this reason it is requested that you let me have not later than 10 a.m. on Wednesday the 8th inst. any proposal you may see fit to make, accompanied by a proper balance sheet and trading or profit and loss account.

If these are forthcoming the Trustees will speedily after theirreceipt again give consideration to any proposal for a reduction of rent that you may make.

REPORT FOR FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Insurance sub-committee of the Finance Committee met on Monday, November 28, Messrs. Wigg, Lillie and Masters being pres-Mr. Sydney Smith, the architect to the Institution, was in attendance and advised the sub-committee that in his opinion the present replacement value of the buildings is £64,000. The subcommittee therefore recommends that the Insurance on the buildings be reduced from £72,000 to £64,000.

The Sub-Committee is also enquiring into various aspects of the insurances and will report further at a later date.

THE MELBOURNE ATHENABUM

Report on the financial position of the Institution together with estimated budget of Receapts and Expenditure for 1933 setting forth extraordinary expenditure for 1932, not likely to recur, and estimate of reduction in expenses submitted to the Finance Committee on Nov. 25, 1932, and generally approved for submission to the General Committee.

I have gone carefully into a budget for 1933.

I estimate that the receipts for 1933 will be £7118 (say £7100) and the expenditure £7139 (say £7150) as per statement herewith.

Extraordinary expenditure as per statement herewith incurred in 1932 and not likely to recur - 2275.

Estimated reductions as per statement herewith - £190. The insurances on the buildings are £72,000. This might be reduced to £60,000 and thus save £50 in premiums.

I estimate the loss on the working for 1933 will be £515. be reduced by non-recurrence of extraordinary expenditure (£275) and estimated reductions (£190), or a total of £465, to £50 for 1933.
