Inaugural Gary Morgan Oration



Rare Books Melbourne is inviting library members and their guests to the inaugural Gary Morgan Oration, which will be delivered in the library on Thursday 14th March.

The Oration, which is free, will feature the University of Melbourne's Professor Andrew May (pictured) speaking about *Melbourne Inc. – little laws and the shaping of a frontier town.*

Drawing on visual images and archival treasures, this presentation will explore the ways in which Melbourne was shaped – materially and socially – through local government regulations in the decades following Melbourne Town Council's incorporation in 1842.

The Oration is named in honour of Gary Morgan, the Executive Chairman of Roy Morgan Research, who is a strong supporter of Melbourne Rare Book Week.
