### Music Event: Phil Manning and Peter Beilharz

One of Australia's best-known guitarists, Phil Manning has single handedly turned more Australians on to the Blues than any other performer. Many Australians know him as a member of <a href="Chain">Chain</a>, the legendary blues band whose contribution to Australian blues music is unparalleled.

Phil's use of a range of acoustic guitars in both slide and fingerpicking styles emphasises his skill at covering a full range of acoustic blues. Phil is a consummate artist who continues to write, create and record but, true to the essence of blues and roots music, it is live on stage where he excels.



Peter Beilharz is Professor of Critical Theory at Sichuan University, China, and has previously held chairs at La Trobe, Harvard, Leeds and Curtin Universities. He has published 30 books and played as support to Chain in 1971.

Formed in 2009 through the Classical Guitar Society of Victoria, the Guitar Orchestra has quickly become Victoria's leading community-based amateur guitar ensemble.

Since its formation, the orchestra has explored a blend of contemporary works, unique



arrangements of time-honoured favourites and modern Australian compositions, striving to showcase the voice of the guitar in a way that has never been heard before.

On Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> December, the orchestra will present a program that centres around reimagining a collection of songs that span from traditional songs of South America and Ireland to a couple of well-known favourites.

#### Scarlet Stiletto Award Winners Announced



The winners of the 31<sup>st</sup> Scarlet Stiletto Awards were announced at a gala ceremony in late November, with Naomi Manuell winning the Melbourne Athenaeum Body in the Library Award and Katrina Watson taking out the runner-up prize.

The overall Scarlet Stiletto Award was won by Newcastle author Nikki Lee Taylor.

This year, 195 short stories competed for 16 awards with a record \$13,400 in prize money.

Melbourne Athenaeum management committee member Barbara Gliddon helped present the Body in the Library awards. Naomi, from Brighton, won for *The First Edition* and Katrina Watson, a retired doctor from Balaclava, took out the runner-up award for *Crime and Management*.

Within the next few weeks, the winning stories will be uploaded to our website for everyone to enjoy.
