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#### **Scarlet Stiletto Winners**

The winners of the 32<sup>nd</sup> Scarlet Stiletto Awards have been announced, and Castlemaine author Julia Harris has taken out the coveted Melbourne Athenaeum Body in the Library Award. Natalie Conyer, from Mosman, NSW, was runner-up.

Melbourne Athenaeum management committee vicepresident Barbara Gliddon helped present the Body in the Library awards, which we have



sponsored for 14 years. The winning entries, *Return or Die* by Julia and *The Ghost Detective* by Natalie, will be uploaded to our website within the next couple of weeks.

This year, 231 short stories competed for more than \$13,000 in prize money, and the overall Scarlet Stiletto Award was won by Healesville author Dr Sandra Thom-Jones.

Author Dinuka McKenzie presented the awards with host Amanda Hampson, who created the popular Tea Ladies series. Dinuka also launched *Scarlet Stiletto*: *The Seventeenth Cut,* an e-book collection of the 2025 winning stories, which is available for purchase <a href="here">here</a>.

#### **Book Recommendation**


Library Manager Fiona recommends all seven of the books in the DS George Cross series by author Tim Sullivan. Book one is *The dentist* but the books can

As the author explains: George Cross is a brilliant detective in the Somerset and Avon police force, based in the Major Crimes Unit in Bristol. He is a detective sergeant which

surprises some people, because he has Autism spectrum condition.

Cross doesn't like crowds, not even crowded rooms. He can't tolerate noise. His people skills are so negligible as to be almost non-existent. These idiosyncrasies and his diffident manner are excused by his superiors because of his astonishing success rate. He has the highest conviction rate in the force – conviction, not arrest. Cross is thorough, methodical and doggedly persistent.

Book eight is due for release in 2026.
